We have been serving the community for the past 14 years and our logo helps to symbolise that we are persistently working to ignite the flame of awareness, rights, equality and fraternity in the human hearts.

For SNP+ the year 2019-20 was a year where we delivered strong performance. The driving factor behind our performance was the effect of anchoring to our core strength areas – our values, our activities and people like you who have always supported our cause.

The focus for the year was primarily on education of children infected and affected with HIV (CLHIV) and welfare for women living with HIV/AIDS (WLHIV) through capacity building and linking them with various government schemes and entitlements. We are happy to say that we have been able to empower **100 women leaders** from amongst the community to advocate on the issues and concerns of PLHIV.

At SNP+ we drive change by working in collaboration with key stakeholders like Ministers, District Magistrate, Additional District Magistrate, MP, MLA, CDPO, Chief Medical Officer of Health, SDO, Block Development Officer, Gram Panchayat, Sundarban Unanyan Mantri among others.

- **170 PLHIV** provided with nutritional support from BDO
- Overall **452** WLHIV linked with government welfare schemes
- **40** WLHIV & **25** PLHIV have opened savings bank account
- **59** WLHIV linked with government entitlements like Adhaar card, voter and ration cards

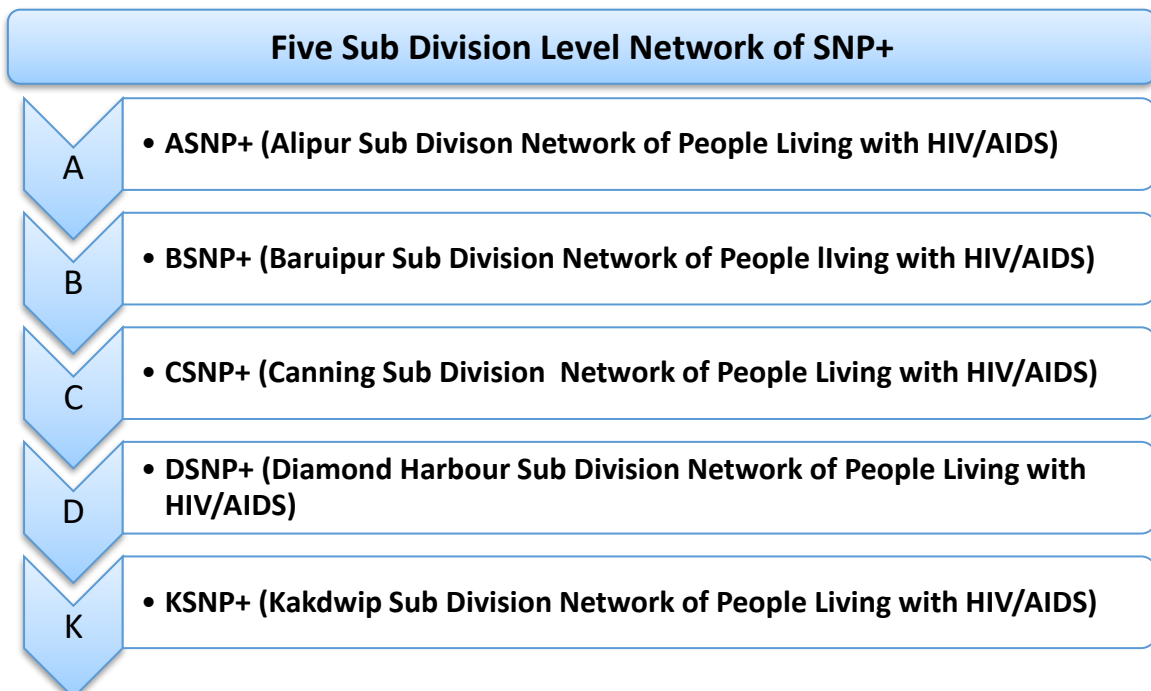
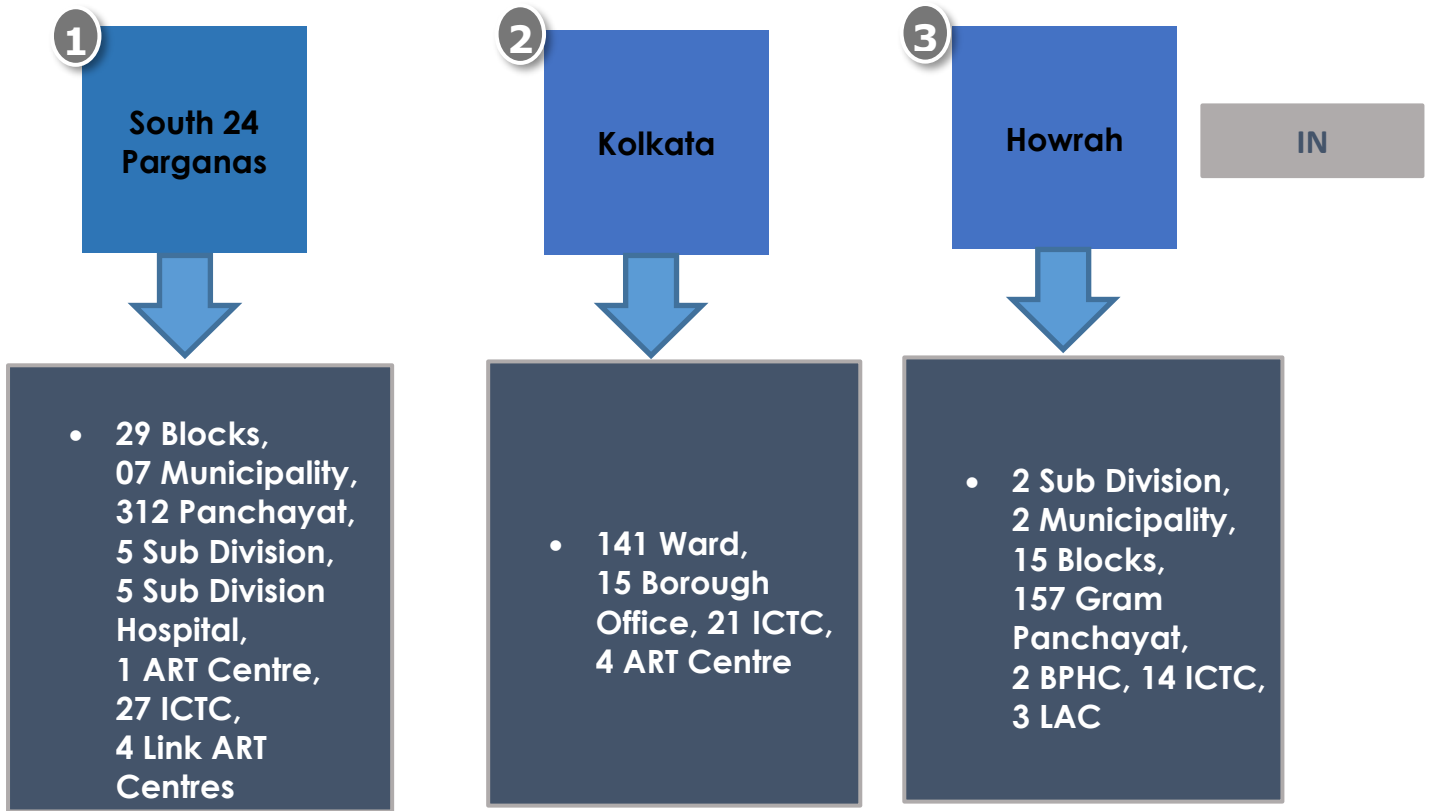

SNP+ is working in 3 districts of West Bengal



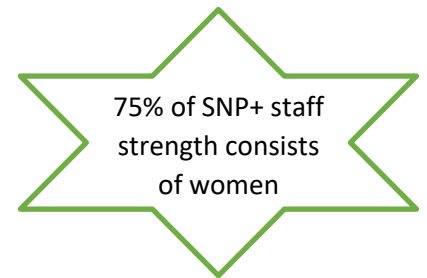


GOVERNING BODY & STAFF

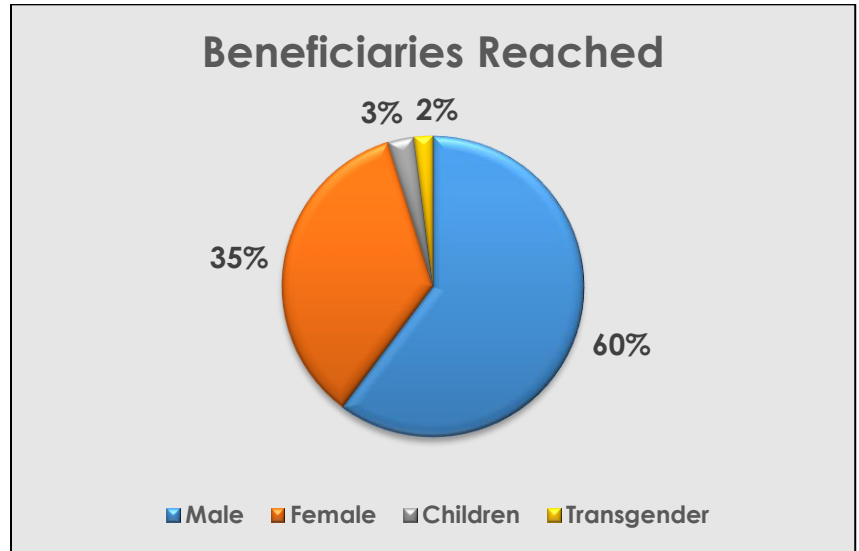

EVENTS & SPECIAL INITIATIVES

WORLD TB DAY – Was observed in March 2019 to build mass awareness around the global epidemic and efforts to eliminate the disease.



PLHIV

A rally was organised from Haji Mohammad Mohsin Square to Kolkata Municipal Corporation (KMC) Building (Chaplin Park) Kolkata. Around **1200 people** had participated in the rally. Advocacy meeting was also held with the Honourable Mayor, Ward Councilor and City TB Officer. Agenda was around linkages for getting nutrition support, CB-NAAT testing and Direct Benefit Transfer (DBT) and various social welfare schemes for



WORLD AIDS DAY – Was celebrated in December, 2019 with support from WBSAP&CS through Kolkata DAPCU, CMOH of South 24 parganas and Diamond Harbour. 10 stalls were put up in Kolkata, South 24 parganas health district and Diamond Harbour health district.

Total 5682 people were screened for HIV, among whom **25** were found to be

HIV positive. Apart from screening, counselling, condom distribution, positive speaking, day long campaigning on information and awareness, various street plays and events were arranged.



RATION DISTRIBUTION – On July 29, 2019 ration was distributed to **52 DRTB patients**. The objective was not only to distribute ration but also to spread awareness around tuberculosis and the importance of treatment adherence. It was also taken note that presumptive cases will be identified from the community. Counselling was another component of the program. Participants consisted of District Tuberculosis Officer, Urban Health District representatives, representatives from THALI and CINI along with SNP+ team members and 52 DRTB patients.



HEALTH SCREENING CAMPS – Various health screening camps were organized in the months of June, July, August and September 2019



Venues were – Ward No. 123 of Behala, DTO Office at Mansatala, Khidirpore (Ward No. 75, 76, 77,78, 79, 124, 135, 140) , Boral Hospital in Garia, Behala Chowrasta (Ward No. 124, 125, 129, 131, 132, 142, 144), Barabazar DTO, S.B Road Urban District RNTCP, Kolkata (Ward No. 8,17, 18, 21, 22, 23, 25, 37, 38,40, to 27, 39, 41, 42, 43, 44, 45,47), Bag Bazar Street (Ward No.

17,42,48,43,25,35,30,40,12,52,50,21,24,23,37,39), Tangra Chest Clinic (Ward No. 57, 58, 59, 65, 66, 67, 68 and 108), DTO Office in Bag Bazar (Ward No. 19,10,45,26,07,09, 17)



Total **299 patients** were examined at these camps. The event was organized with funding and technical support from WHP. The camps were organized to provide treatment, care and support to suspected TB patients from the high risk and at-risk communities. A medical practitioner examined the patients and X-ray and sputum collection was also done. Free medicines were distributed.

Advocacy & Justice for Rinku Roy, an HIV positive pregnant woman

South 24 PG Network of People Living with HIV/AIDS (SNP+) shared the matter of Rinku Roy with all relevant stakeholders - CMOH, MRBH, JD-CST, WBSAP&CS, RC-NACO and other related officials. JD-CST spoke with the Superintendent of MR Bangur Hospital and made an official enquiry into the matter from the Health Department. After which, RC-NACO & AD-Nursing also visited the hospital. The Superintendent assured of an official enquiry and said that the word "HIV positive" from the death certificate will be removed. As part of our advocacy initiative, we met with the CMOH who said that he will make sure that such an incident is never repeated as health care services is the right of all individuals and it is the duty of officials of health care settings to deliver it impartially to all. We had also advocated with the electronic and print media.

এইচআইভির ভয় কাটিয়ে ওঁদেরও কাছে টানছে পূজো



দুগ্ধা দুগ্ধা

স্বামী মল্লিক

খেকে যান এইচআইভি পঞ্জিটিভের। শরীরের প্রতিরোধ ক্ষমতা কমে যাওয়ার অনেক ক্ষেত্রেই এইচআইভি-র দোসর হয়ে আসে 'রাজরোগ'। তাই উৎসবেও বাড়ির চার দেওয়ালের ভিতরে বন্দি থেকে যান ক্ষিতীশ-ঝুমারা। বর্তমানে কয়েক হাজার এইচআইভি পঞ্জিটিভদের নিয়ে কাজ করা ক্ষিতীশের কথায়, "অসুখের প্রথম দিকে পূজো বলে কিছুই ছিল না। ওষুধের টাকা কোথা থেকে আসবে, সংসার কী ভাবে চলবে, সেই চিন্তাতেই রাতে ঘুম হত না।" আর কিশোরী ঝুমার আফশোস, "আমারও তো হচ্ছে করে মগুপে গিয়ে মাকে দেখার। কিন্তু বাড়ি থেকে খুব একটা বেরোই না। তবে এখনও তো কেউ জানেই না যে...।"

সমাজের জনকণ্ঠন থেকে রেহাই নেই এদের নিয়ে কাজ করা সমাজকর্মীদেরও। হাবডার শিল্পী ইন্দ্রজিৎ পোন্দার বলেন, "গত বছর চন্দননগরে জগদ্ধাত্রী প্রতিমা তৈরি করতে গিয়েছিলাম। এক বয়স্ক উদ্যোক্তা ফেসবুকে শিশুদের সঙ্গে আমার কিছু ছবি দেখে ওদের পরিচয় জানতে চেয়েছিলেন। ওরা এইচআইভি পঞ্জিটিভ শুনেই আমার থেকে দু'পা পিছিয়ে গেলেন।"

তবে দুর্গাপূজোর আবহে এই দুর্ভাগ্য ঘটলে এইচআইভি পঞ্জিটিভদের কাছে টানছে পূর্ব কলকাতার একটি পূজো কমিটি। আমডাঙার ঝুমা বা বাবাসতের রাবেয়া খাতুনের (নাম পরিবর্তিত) মতো একাধিক এইচআইভি পঞ্জিটিভ কিশোরীর তৈরি বাঁশের হারিকেন, পাটের পুতুল, শীতলপাটির ব্যাগে সাজছে ট্যাংরার কামারডাঙা সাধারণ দুর্গোৎসব সমিতির পূজোমগুপ। প্রতিমা তৈরির সঙ্গে সঙ্গে নিজের বাড়িতে ১০ জন কিশোরীকে হাতে হাতে সেই কাজ শেখাচ্ছেন ইন্দ্রজিৎ।

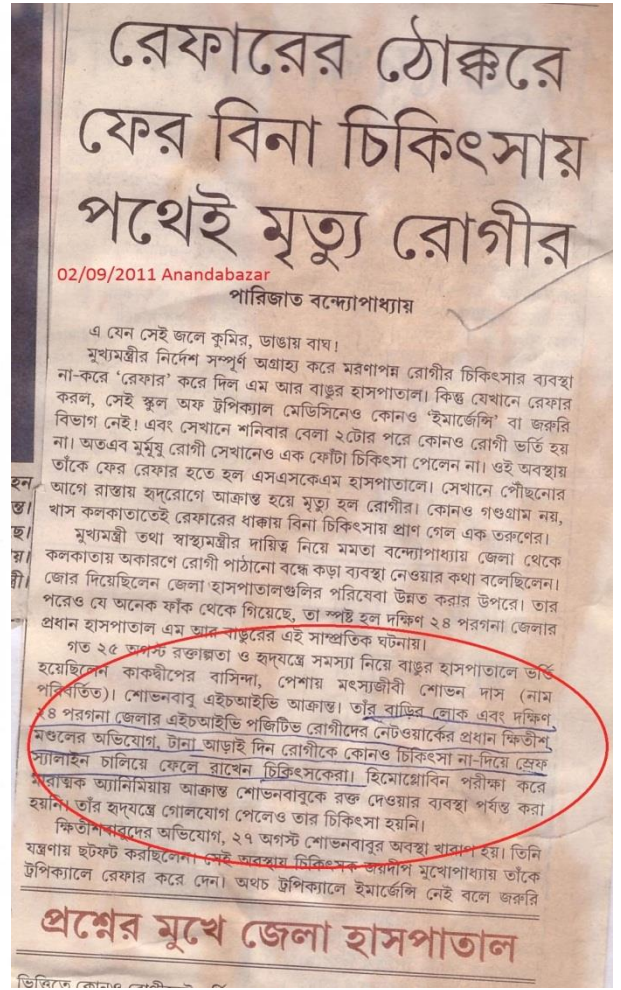
এমন ভাবনা কেন? ইন্দ্রজিৎের কথায়, "এদের চেয়ে অসহায় আর কেউ নয়। তাই পূজোর সঙ্গে এদের জড়তে চেয়েছিলাম। রোগী নয়, রোগকে ঘৃণা করুন— পূজোর এই বার্তা দিতে চাই।" পূজো কমিটির তরফে সমীর সাহা জানাচ্ছেন, পূজোকে সর্বজনীন করার লক্ষ্যে এই প্রস্তাবে সম্মতি দিয়েছেন তাঁরা। ঝুটিপূজোর উপচারেও তাই আপন করে নিয়েছেন এই প্রান্তিক মানুষদের।

আপাতত তাই নাওয়া-খাওয়া ভুলে ব্যাগ-পুতুল বানাতে ব্যস্ত ঝুমারা-ঝুমারা। একযোগে তারা বলছে, "জুন থেকে পূজোর কাজ করছি। বেশ ভাল লাগছে।"

উনিশ বছর আগে যখন ধরা পড়ে যে, তিনি এইচআইভি পঞ্জিটিভ, ক্যানিংয়ের একচিলতে দোকানটি বন্ধ করে দিতে বাধ্য হয়েছিলেন ক্ষিতীশ মগুলা। কারণ, দোকানে খদ্দেররা আসতেন না। তিন বছরের মেয়ে আর এক বছরের ছেলেকে নিয়ে সে সময়ে গ্রামে একঘরে হয়ে পড়েছিলেন তিনি। থালাসেমিয়ার আক্রান্ত, আমডাঙার বছর বোলার ঝুমা মাইতির (নাম পরিবর্তিত) রক্ত পরীক্ষায় এইচআইভি (হিউম্যান ইমিউনোডেফিসিয়েন্সি ভাইরাস) ধরা পড়ে ছ'সাত মাস আগে। সে কথা স্মলে আজও জানানোর সাহস করেনি সে। "ভয় হয়, জানতে পারলে স্মলে বন্ধুরা পাশে বসবে না। গ্রামেও থাকতে দেবে না," বলছে ঝুমা।

ছুতমার্গ আর ভ্রান্ত ধারণার সঙ্গে লড়াই করতে করতে সমাজের এক প্রান্তে গিয়ে দাঁড়ানো এইচআইভি পঞ্জিটিভ মানুষগুলোর কাছে তাই দুর্গাপূজোর আনাদা মাহাত্ম্য নেই। পূজোর খিমের টঙ্কর অথবা সাবের আচার-অনুষ্ঠানের মূল স্রোত থেকে দূরে দূরেই থেকে যান তাঁরা।

পরিসংখ্যান বলছে, এইচআইভি পঞ্জিটিভদের সংখ্যার নিরিখে ভারত বিশ্বে তৃতীয়। পশ্চিমবঙ্গে বাস দেশের প্রায় ছয় শতাংশ এইচআইভি পঞ্জিটিভ মানুষের। 'ন্যাশনাল এডস কন্ট্রোল অর্গানাইজেশন' (ন্যাকো) সম্প্রতি জানিয়েছে, ২০১৮-১৯ সালে এ দেশে রক্ত নেওয়ার মাধ্যমে ১৩৪২ জন মানুষের রক্তে এই ভাইরাস ঢুকেছে। বার মধ্য দ্বিতীয় স্থানে এই রাজ্য। তবে সময়ের সঙ্গে সঙ্গে এ রাজ্যে এইচআইভি পঞ্জিটিভদের সংখ্যা কমলেও ছুতমার্গ রয়ে গিয়েছে পুরোদমে। যেমন অনেকেরই ধারণা, এইচআইভি পঞ্জিটিভদের স্পর্শ করা হলে বা 'বাড়িচার' করলে এই ভাইরাস শরীরে প্রবেশ করে। কেউ মনে করেন, এইচআইভি পঞ্জিটিভ হলে অচিরেই তাঁর মৃত্যু হয়। এই ধরনের ভ্রান্ত ধারণার জেরে অজ্ঞত হয়েই





MOST SIGNIFICANT CHANGES STORIES



“I was shattered the day I came to know the HIV status of my husband, myself along with my two children. We were all HIV positive. My world had come to a complete halt” says a 35 years old Jarina Gharami of Rajbora Gram, Baruipur. The Medical College Counsellor had given us the address of SNP+

The first day we went there I could not hold back my tears. I don't remember for how long I cried. Khitishda and Susantada spoke to us and explained a lot of things. Slowly we started going there for support group meetings and getting ration support for my son and daughter. Those were the most difficult years of our life when we were ostracised from family and friends and also financially broke. My husband could not work as he was very sick. Earlier he used to sell vegetables and fruits. He has died four years back. But I feel SNP+ has brought out the strength in me. Khitishda's mentoring has helped me to become what I am today. I am indebted to SNP+

The woman who hardly went out of her house is now unhesitant to speak in public. I am a social worker at SNP+ drawing a salary of Rs.5000/- every month. My children are pursuing their education as I always dreamt.

It was a proud moment for me when we went to the District Magistrate's Office in Alipore and successfully advocated for supporting the education of 37 BPL CLHIV. This was the day I felt my life had some meaning. Those 37 children are just like my own son and daughter. These children are now getting scholarship of Rs.2000/- every month. This was a dream come true and a major achievement in my life.

Today I feel I have more to give to life. I want to stand beside all those HIV positive people who have lost their hope and are fighting against discrimination and stigma. “Hum honge kamayab, hum honge kamayab ek din, maan mein hai viswas pura hai viswas...”



Tinku Roy, a resident of Sonarpur, West Bengal is a member of SNP+

2006 was the year I was detected HIV positive along with my 6 years old son. The moment my husband came to know about our HIV status he deserted both of us. He never came back.

Both my parents had died long time back. So, I had no place to go to. My sisters and other relatives avoided me. I wanted to commit suicide because I had no way out.

If SNP+ had not stood by us at that point of time, we would have committed suicide.

My son, Nitish, is now 21 years studying in 1st Year College. He is my lifeline.

I am a social worker at SNP+ that is how I am able to meet the household expenses and that of my son's education.

When my husband left me, I had no income and no educational background. I did not know how to take care of the everyday expenses. But I was determined to educate my son and give him the best. With the help of SNP+ I was able to send my son to Anandaghar, a home for children in Madhyamgram. There they took care of his education and nutrition till he was 15 years of age. SNP+ also helped me to get ration and books for my son.

It was then that my belief in life came back and I slowly got involved with the activities and movement of SNP+

I had also been part of the national movement for passing the HIV Bill. I had gone to Delhi and I was also part of the "HIV Bill dharna". My 15 years of association with this organization is a long story and I have seen the organization growing and reaching out to people like me in distress specially those for whom all doors are shut. Now I am part of the Advocacy team of our organization. I am regularly going to MR Bangur Hospital for advocating on various issues and concerns of PLHIV.

Today my age has increased and my hairs are slowly turning grey but the shine in my eyes is still there. SNP+ has given me a new lease of life. My son is studying and is preparing for government jobs.

"I owe my journey to SNP+ who has helped me realise my potential. It is only because of SNP+ that people like us are still alive. Thank you SNP+ for all that you have done for me".
